The Ticket to Work program can help veterans age **18 through** 64 who receive Social Security disability benefits (SSDI and/or SSI) explore their **work options** and **pursue** their **career goals**.

The Ticket to Work Program

- Supports career development for people with disabilities who want to work
- Is for Social Security disability beneficiaries age 18 through 64
- Is free and voluntary

- Pursue your education
- Try different jobs
- Start a career

Employment Networks (EN)



ENs are organizations and agencies that entered into an agreement with Social Security to provide:

- free employment services
- vocational rehabilitation services
- and other types of support services to people receiving Social Security disability benefits with disabilities under the Ticket to Work program.

Many Vocational Rehabilitation Agencies also serve as ENs.

EN services may include:

- Career Planning
- Job Leads and Job Placement
- Ongoing Employment Support
- Benefits Counseling





Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment (VR&E) Services

VR&E is a program of the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

- You may receive vocational rehabilitation and employment services to help with job training, employment accommodations, resume development, and job seeking skills coaching.
- Other services may be provided to assist veterans in starting their own businesses or independent living services for those who have severe disabilities that make traditional employment difficult.


